the Spirit to, "...Go near, and join thyself to this chariot." As we approached him he was arguing with a teacher who was attempting to calm him down to no avail. I instructed Joseph my two year old to hand him a tract. Joseph quickly closed the gap and smiled at him stretching out his



hand in expectation for this student to take it. When the student saw him his countenance quickly changed and his face lighted up with a smile. He then squatted down to Joseph's level and took the tract from Joseph's tiny finger tips. He spoke a few kind words to him with a smile on his face but that was all the time left, for the police had then reached him. Realizing he was now surrounded the student thought he had to give back the tract but I told him it was his to keep. He nodded in thanks and put it into his back pocket. We later saw the police handcuffing him as he was placed into the police car. I cannot tell you what kind of family he was born into here on earth but I can tell you if he read that tract and trusted Christ he is now born into the great family of God in heaven.

I was pleased to take out 12 members of Straight Paths Baptist Church for their first time to, Enterprise Community College (ECC) and George Wallace College, in AL.

When I went to look for the best place to setup at ECC I saw a 3x4 sign that said, "Free Speech Area" (FSA). We waited just before the class break just incase the campus tried to shut us down. I quickly gathered a small crowd together in the F.S.A. while the rest of those with me were busy passing out tracts and witnessing. One

Her father, Rick spent about thirty minutes opening the Bible and dealing with him. We were very grateful to see this one student asked Christ to save him within the time we had there.
