Greetings in the name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Campus ministry has been both exciting and challenging. It is always wonderful to be able to share the news of our Lord with students that are lost in darkness and to encourage Christian students to be a bold witness for Christ. At the same time there are challenges in dealing with those in the administration who want to stop the spread of the gospel. Here are some highlights from some of the campuses since my last prayer letter.

**Challenges with Victory:**

Even though Caldwell Community College had never been a problem in the past, times have changed. There were many students gathered around who were glad to hear the gospel message and openly received tracts. They were coming up and sitting down on the benches to listen to the preaching. Eventually, a policeman told me I had to leave because the president had complained to him that I was disturbing classes. I was bewildered as to how I could possibly be disrupting classes outside in the area I was in. The officer said if I did not leave I would be arrested for trespassing. I asked him how he could arrest me for trespassing on public property. After some sound arguments he readily agreed he couldn't arrest me for trespassing but he turned right around and said he would arrest me for

disorderly conduct instead. I told him that I disagreed that my conduct was in anyway was disorderly and that he was applying the law improperly. Seeing I was not getting anywhere with him I went to speak to the president who was standing about 30 yards away.



While conversing with the president I found out he never told the officer that I was disturbing classes. Had I been a little quicker on my feet I would have said to the officer, "Well since I'm not disturbing classes this nullifies a disorderly conduct charge, and there is no reason I can not to continue. However, the officer was aggravated and just wanted me to leave. It had been such a good day so I decided to leave at this point and battle it out on the phone. Thankfully later that day another brother contacted the college and explained our rights to them. We found out they had no policy for permits and that



they were just making it up (lying). Realizing they had made a huge legal blunder that could be quite embarrassing and costly for them; they quickly apologized

While ministering at Winthrop University students were readily taking many tracts, and there was good witnessing opportunities. However, once again the police were called and at first the officer wanted us to leave but after some time of persuasion the officer told us to have a good day. Victory in his name again!

Ministering to the students at Valdosta State University in GA



went very well. There were lots of tracts being taken and one-on-one witnessing. Then a man informed me I was not in the, "free speech area." I then pointed to a group of three people on my one side and then to another group on my other side who were talking like me. I then asked, "Why are they not told to go to the free speech area?" They want Jesus in a "zone." Keep him in the church wall zone, keep him on the cross zone, keep him in the grave zone and keep him in the free speech zone but don't bring Him outside, in the public, schools, government, etc. Well, to be peaceable I went there anyway. Later on five police officers showed up telling us we had to have an advance notice and we must leave. I began to tell them about Daniel and John Bunyon who suffered for righteousness sake and that these times are coming, but we are going to

preach even if it means arrest. After about five minute's one officer came up to me, put his hand out to shake mine and said, "You just keep on doing what you were doing." Oh what joy! The Lord worked in our favor! They didn't bother us and we had a great time with students gathering and taking tracts.

### **No Resistance:**

It was onto Florida State in Tallahassee. This is always a favorite campus of mine. There is usually a crowd of students that will stand to listen. One student from last year came up and said, "Hi BibleGreg." He is one of those that can pull out lots of stories that he has heard as to why the Bible really means something other than what it says. Nonetheless, he came to talk about the Bible and that is why I was there. Many other students concerned about their eternal souls listened and what blessing to share with them the saving power of Christ Jesus. Josiah and Joseph were there with me passing out tracts and quoting Bible verses.

There were also no problems at Troy State University or the University in Birmingham, Alabama.

### **Two New Church Campus Ministries:**

I had started Straight Paths Baptist Church in Alabama to



minister at two different colleges near them. All was going great but after a while the campuses shut them down and told them not

to come back. This year I came to fix this injustice. I sent out a letter with numerous court cases and urged them not to stop us. We went out there again this year and we had no problems. Amen! The church has gone back since and all is going well. That first day on the way out we met two Christian students, Austin & Korey who were headed in to pass out tracts and witness. They were praying for boldness when they saw our sign, "Read John 3". Korey told us he was convicted about not sharing his faith especially after the campus had been holding large groups of Atheist gatherings there. They said the teachers are very outspoken in classes about atheism and they boldly make a



mock of Christianity. One teacher spues out profanity and therefore is sadly admired by the students. There is another feminist teacher that rallies students and promoted Darwin Days.
