I have had many blessing since my letter last month. The Lord has allowed me to have much favor here and I am so very thankful for His great love and confirmation of us being here in this third world country of Belize. Here are just a few highlights below.

Parks here have next to nothing but I found one that had a few swings and monkey bars and took my children to play there one evening. I put my wallet in the cubbyhole of the van's door so I wouldn't lose it. The next morning as we were heading to the immigration office I noticed that my wallet was missing. We immediately prayed and headed out to backtrack. This was at 10 o'clock in the morning and I knew there were

already lots of adults and children that had passed by this busy place on foot since the night before. My faith was saying that the Lord Jesus could have easily have blinded anyone from seeing my wallet. Upon arrival I saw it on the ground where I had parked which was right next to two streets. It was untouched on the ground about 50 yards from a group of teenagers that were standing around when I picked it up. Thank you Jesus!!!

Immigration has been a very favorable experience for me. I spoke with many who have went or are still going through the process. Virtually all of them gave me horrifying accounts of what took place. Thankfully

we only ended up stamping

once. I applied for my volunteer work permit with only one week left before stamping again. Without a miracle from the Lord I could not see how this could have been approved in time. It normally takes 2-3 weeks if it is even approved at all. To the praises of Jesus Christ it was approved in just three days! Because it was granted it will keep us from stamping which would take hours if not a whole day each month. Thankfully each time we went to the immigration

office they would take us right in. This happened no less than five times. There were always 75 to 150 people waiting there. The permit cost us \$600 BZ. Had we went each month and stamped it would have cost us \$5,300 for an entire year. There were a few other offices I went to that also expedited the documents I needed and each one was almost as amazing. I had some of these workers request that I



would pray for them. I would ask that you also remember them in your prayers as they have a difficult jobs.

Church gatherings have been going very well. We are traveling by bus to meet with our new church plant in Hattieville with the Parkinsons. I love their zeal for the



Lord and His word! In Belmopan we had a total of 21 gathered outside of our apartment last time. we are thankful to Don Whitecar for donating chairs so everyone could have a seat. The fellowship has been so great and we desire that Christ to be glorified.

The local market is a great place to spread the Gospel. Many are very open to speak with us. The children and I have been singing, tracting and witnessing there twice a week. I also met a man named Mike there who is a professing atheist. He is from the US and told me I had met his match this time. However, he didn't know he was talking to the campus preacher, BilbeGreg. We had a good talk and he is a very lively fellow. He called me on his own a week later and came over to our apartment. We ended up spending four hours talking together. He is open to discussing the Bible, God etc. I look forward to what the Lord has in store and would ask for your prayers.

Ministering on the campus of the University of Belize has been blessed as well. One big difference is most of the students here have more time to stop and talk between their classes then the US. Amy also finds it easier to speak to students here. I will wait on



shaded walk ways for students to pass. This way when I strike up a conversation we don't burn so bad. I shared the gospel of grace with a J.W. student, E-lo (Pictured above) along with other students in a works based religious system. Also pray for Ryan who told me he has been recently thinking about spiritual things. He said he did not have any religious background. Alex is a professing Christian student who was not able to instruct me on how to share the gospel. He said he was open to me teaching him.

Please continue to pray for my health. My headaches come and go because of the lack of oxygen to my brain. Each day the Lord has allowed me to stay alive by His grace. I am thankful and glad that I have this time to spend with my family and to minister here in Belize.
